One of the most exhilarating trips was climbing Half Dome in Yosemite with Stephen





My dream for my children is to be happy and use their gifts to serve others.


MORE ABOUT MONICA

My dream for my children is to discover their passion, knowing they are unconditionally loved.


















OUR TIME TOGETHER




Heams FOR OUR FUTURE
